**Date:** 05/09/2022

**Notes:** Those in attendance included local residents, political candidates and many who

spoke against public transit.

Harbor Springs City Council

**Date:** 05/02/2022

**Notes:** Short Term Rentals (STRs) and Affordable Housing. The item that prompted the most

discussion was a proposal by the Planning Commission for a moratorium or

application due date for STR's to give time for more study about how to either limit or manage STRs in Harbor Springs. Two Council members excused themselves from voting since they own STR property. In my opinion, however, their involvement in the discussion had a chilling effect since they were defensive about any criticism of STRs and their impact. Several citizens also commented. Topics included possible negative impact, the new City regulation program, complaints, rising cost of housing, right to own property, changing nature of Harbor Springs, and the need for more data such as how many, where, trends, and complaints. In the end the vote was 2-1 for a moratorium, but the interpretation was that they needed 3 for a majority so the motion failed. The Council then asked the Assessor/Zoning Administrator for a

comprehensive report on STRs before taking any further action.
