the changes mentioned the Redevelopment Ready Community

designation that many seem to think is giving the State of Michigan the right to take over the city, according to these same people. The RRC (best practices) was developed by the Michigan Economic Development

Corporation and was never mentioned in the MP or the

Planning Commission presentation. Many public commentors said they had no knowledge of any changes, after months of Planning Commission meetings and public hearings. They don't want any changes to the

meetings and public hearings. They don't want any changes to the

city...affordable housing included.

Lactation Consultant and provides high level breastfeeding support to both health department and hospital patients. She can bill insurance to cover most of the costs of the position. There was much discussion about the tendency of government programs to grow and expand, and questions

about "the government" coming into people's homes. The vote was 5-3 to approve the creation of the position.

The 3rd vote was a 6-2 vote to not send a resolution to Antrim County urging them to reconsider the change in Commissioner assignments to the BOH.
